
JewishGen Research Divisions (Formerly SIGs)

- https://www.jewishgen.org/JewishGen/researchdivisions.htm
- Various Research Divisions cover the various areas covered by JewishGen and coordinate
 projects to capture and preserve records, images, and other information about their area
 of responsibility.

JewishGen Country/Regional Databases

- https://www.jewishgen.org/databases/
- Includes indexed records largely indexed by volunteers
- JewishGen is organized by Research Division (each headed by a volunteer Research Director that coordinates indexing and other projects in the covered area)
- Allows searching of indexed records that are added to and updated regularly—Ukraine has been adding ~100,000 indexed records each month
- Relevant databases
 - Ukraine specifically covered Russian-Empire Ukraine (but Subcarpathia records can be found with a Ukraine-specific search)
 - o Hungary database will include Subcarpathia as well as some border areas

- Gesher Galicia (its own organization, but searchable via JewishGen) and includes records from towns now located in Ukraine/Poland
- o JRI-Poland (its own organization, but searchable via JewishGen) and will include records from towns now located in Ukraine/Poland

- Search results



Sample JewishGen database search results. You can learn more about the particular record set by clicking in the area denoted with the red circle, and you can see the actual search results by clicking the button on the right (grey circle).

- Record set information (red circle above)
 - o May contain information about the project coordinator for more information
 - o May give information about acquiring original images (if not available in search results)
 - o May have an inventory of what is included in the record set
 - May have information about what is still to be completed, or if the record set is complete
- Results button (grey button above)
 - Every record set has different information and may be in a slightly different format.
 Sometimes there are links to URLs with original images, and if not there is generally an archive citation for where the original record can be found.
 - IMPORTANT NOTE: OFTEN ONLY IDENTIFYING INFORMATION IS INDEXED, AND THE ORIGINAL RECORD WILL HAVE SIGNIFICANTLY MORE INFORMATION. LOOK AT/ACQUIRE THAT ORIGINAL RECORD!

This is a sample of results when you click on the button to get search results. The red circle above will bring you to the same description of the record set as does the red circle in the previous image. Here, the green circle shows the archive citation for where the original image may be found. Sometimes there will be a link that will bring you to the original image either hosted on JewishGen servers or another repository (FamilySearch, archive page, etc.)

JewishGen Holocaust Database

- https://www.jewishgen.org/databases/holocaust/
- Same interface as regional databases but includes Holocaust-specific record sets
 - o Entries may also include non-Jews who were impacted.
- Many collaborative efforts with other organizations

JewishGen Unified Database

- https://www.jewishgen.org/databases/all/
- Allows simultaneous search across all databases on JewishGen
- Can search two fields simultaneously for free (only one for others), which can narrow down results.

JewishGen Yizkor Books

- https://www.jewishgen.org/yizkor/
- Translations of town/district Yizkor books
 - o Only exist for town projects with funding to pay for translations
 - o Some have only portions translated, but they are online.
 - o Can buy hardcover versions of completed translations

JewishGen KehilaLinks

- https://kehilalinks.jewishgen.org/ukraine.html
- Volunteer-run ("Town Leader") town-focused pages.
- No specific format, so some are comprehensive and others are less so.
- May contain photographs, record sets, histories—but no standardized expectations.
- Town Leader may have mailing list to unite descendants—and those descendants may contain relatives
- You can volunteer to be a Town Leader for a town that lacks one.

JewishGen Online Classes

- https://www.jewishgen.org/Education/
- Virtual classes ranging from super-basic to much more specialized

JewishGen Family Finder

- Search for others researching your ancestral surname, location or both
- Register your own research interests FOR FREE to leave breadcrumbs for future researchers

JewishGen Communities Database/Gazetteer

- Great even if you're not researching Jewish ancestry
- JewishGen Communities Database
 - o https://www.jewishgen.org/Communities/Search.asp
 - o Covers towns with significant Jewish populations (so not every single village)

- Accounts for town name changes (particularly applicable in Subcarpathia), varying languages (sometimes Yiddish town names differed significantly from the secular name), and even "sounds like" to account for garbles or phonetic spellings of town names.
- o Gives country/district (Guberniya/Megye/etc) during varying time periods which may help narrow down possibilities.

• JewishGen Gazeteer

- o https://www.jewishgen.org/Communities/LocTown.asp
- o Accounts for many more villages than Communities Database
- Can see all villages within a radius, so it can help if you know a village was near a larger town.

Results of a search of JewishGen's Communities Database for towns phonetically close to "Novoselice." Clicking the logo next to each name will give significantly more information about each town. Note the variety of names associated with each town which may help to identify which is the town of interest. The information about geographic boundaries associated with each town may help to identify the correct town. And the # of JGFF Entries can be clicked on to see who has registered themselves in the JewishGen Family Finder as researching families from each town.


JRI-Poland

- Its own organization
- Free search with registration (also available via JewishGen but additional search capacity without JewishGen donation) and different search features—use both.
- Covers many areas of the former Galicia—anything with records kept in Polish State Archives
- Often links to images of original records

JRI-Poland Town Explorer

• Shows availability of Jewish records for the town interactively

- Shows availability of mixed (Jewish & non-Jewish records)
- Even if your family isn't Jewish, it can point you to possible locations for records
 - o Calls out some existing mixed (all religion) civil registration for specific towns.
- Contact Town Leader
- Use Google Chrome (as of May 2024 when writing this, it doesn't work on Firefox)



JRI-Poland's Town Explorer—Clicking on the dots (after logging in) will give information about document acquisition and transcription efforts for a particular town.

JRI-Poland Forum

- https://forum.jri-poland.org/
- Place to post questions about documents in the area covered by JRI-Poland
- Look at others' questions on same towns to guide your own research

JRI-Poland Record Search

• Currently I prefer their legacy search

- Same results as through JewishGen's Poland Database but can zero in on specific records more easily
- Access to four simultaneous search fields (instead of one without donation on JewishGen's Poland Database).
- Can search within radius of specified town, year range and other things that JewishGen doesn't have.
- Often links to original images hosted on Polish State Archives. (Sometimes the link is a few pages off, but it's usually very close.)

JRI-Poland Projects

- https://www.jri-poland.org/project-explorer/
- Variety of ongoing projects ranging from Holocaust-specific to vital or other records for a particular district or town.
- Donations give full spreadsheet access (sometimes easier to sort/search than the online search feature) to records indexed for a particular project
- Donations give early access before records are searchable online—sometimes a year or more in advance.
- Listed to show status and requirements for completion (usually funding)
- Volunteer to lead one!

Gesher Galicia (Gesher=Bridge)

- Its own organization
- Free search (also available via JewishGen but additional search capacity without JewishGen donation) and different search features—use both.
- Covers the former Galicia, overlaps geographically with parts of JRI-Poland
- Some record sets include non-Jews
- Often links to images of original records with paid membership

Gesher Galicia Town Locator

- Shows repository for records for various religions (not just Jewish)


Gesher Galicia's Town Locator gives the location where records of various types/religions were kept.

- Range from vital record acquisition/indexing to map acquisitions-

Gesher Galicia Map Room

- Includes links to detailed historic maps of the region
- Includes scanned-from-archive original maps
 - Regional maps
 - o Cadastral maps
 - Street maps (usually for larger towns/cities)
 - Data maps (Interactive, correlating a town's vital records with cadastral maps.
 Currently for only a few towns.)
 - Additional map types.





Gesher Galicia (Paid) Membership-Only


- Access to quarterly high-quality newsletter
- Access to images for indexed records
- Access to live webinars and a number of prior recordings of webinars
- Library with multiple digitized books

Gesher Galicia Record search

- https://www.geshergalicia.org/all-galicia-database/
- Can choose "Advanced Search" to narrow down search by year, address, repository and more.
- Can filter by type of record, record search, and more upon left side of search results
- Need to expand individual results for full indexed information
